

A recent journey on the steam train between Holt and Sheringham in Norfolk saw the beginning of a train of thought (sorry!). It had to do with what I might have become. Allow me to explain...

When my father retired he had reached the dizzy heights of being the manager of the Job Centre in Bury St Edmunds. He enjoyed his weekly slot on Radio Suffolk about available jobs! But I wasn't heading into the Civil Service either.
